## Introduction to PicLens

### Short

If you regularly are looking for pictures through Google (or Flickr), searching for great YouTube movies or searching for that particular book at Amazon, then you are spending (too much!) time on scrolling down, clicking on the next page, etc. It takes forever to find that perfect picture that is hidden at page 17! There must be a lifehack to go to page 17 in one click! You know what? Here it is...

### Cut

View 200 picture in 20 seconds!

### Shortcut

PicLens transforms your browser into a full-screen, 3D experience for viewing photos and videos across the web. This software will enable to view thousands of pictures within seconds with an easy scroll bar and select images from the web to use. Other traditional applications would waste several minutes or hours to perform this function. You can scroll with your mouse to zoom in and out and drag the navigation to reviewing easily up to 200 pictures in 20 seconds.

In order to get maximum effectiveness of this product, we advise use of Mozilla Firefox. To install Firefox free onto your machine, please visit <http://www.mozilla.com/en-US/>

Then visit <http://www.piclens.com> and install the plug-in.

### Longcut

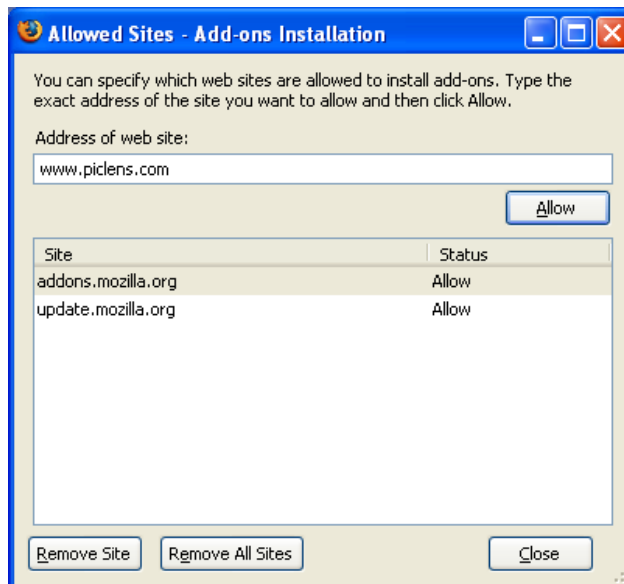
1. Go to <http://www.piclens.com>
2. Click the Green Download button on the right hand side of the screen.



3. Click on the Edit Options button in the top right hand corner.

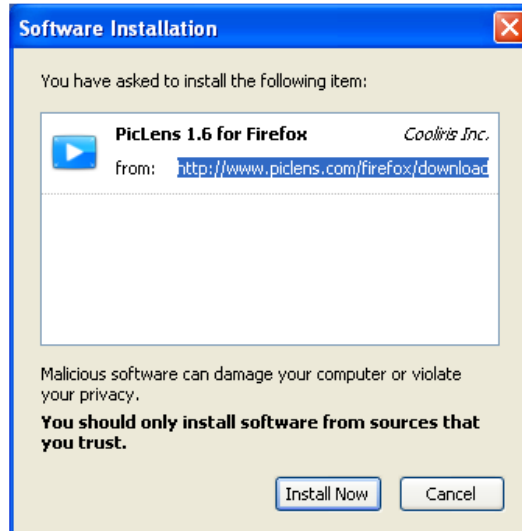


4. Select **Allow**.

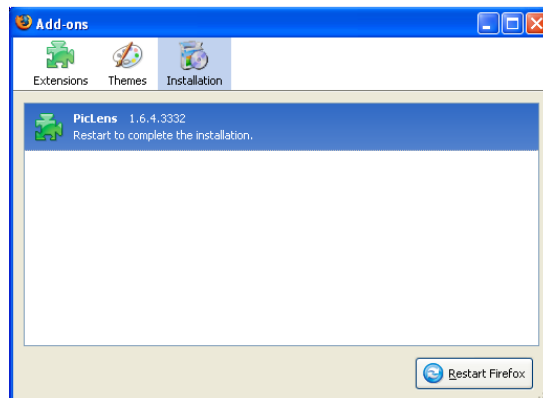


5. Then click **Close** to shut the pop-up window
6. Click the Green Download button on the right hand side of the screen again (Step 2)

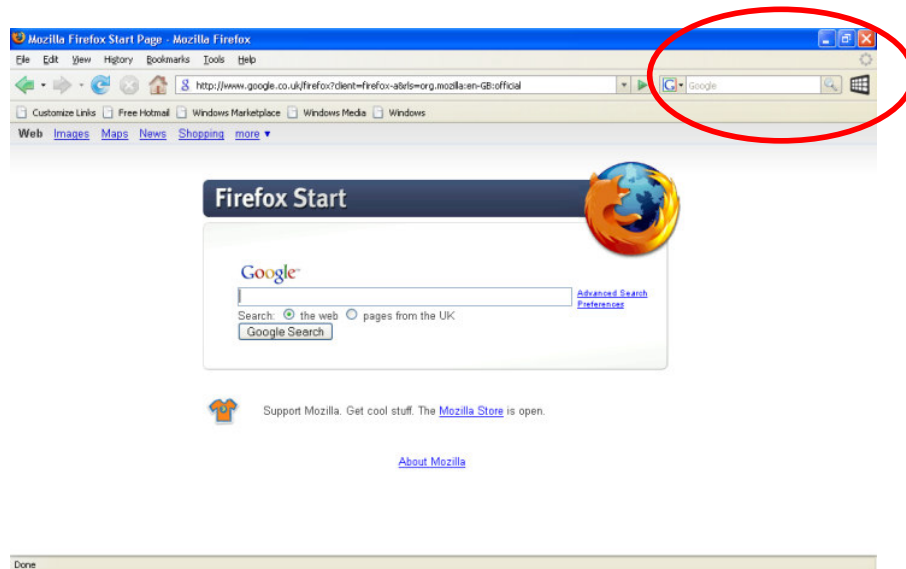
7. Click the **Install Now** button to install the software.



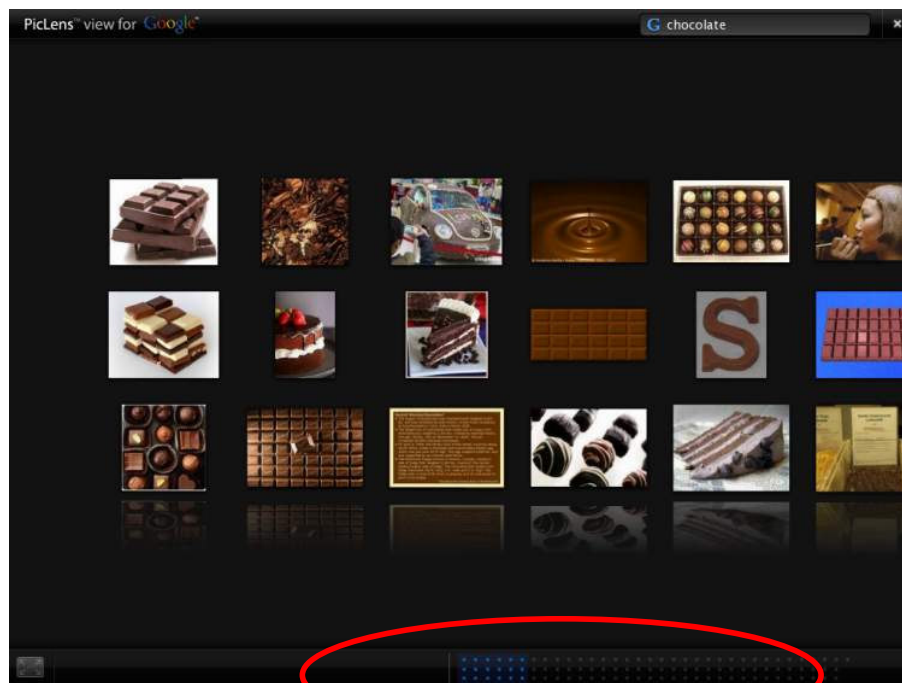
8. The software is now ready to be installed. Click **Restart Firefox**.



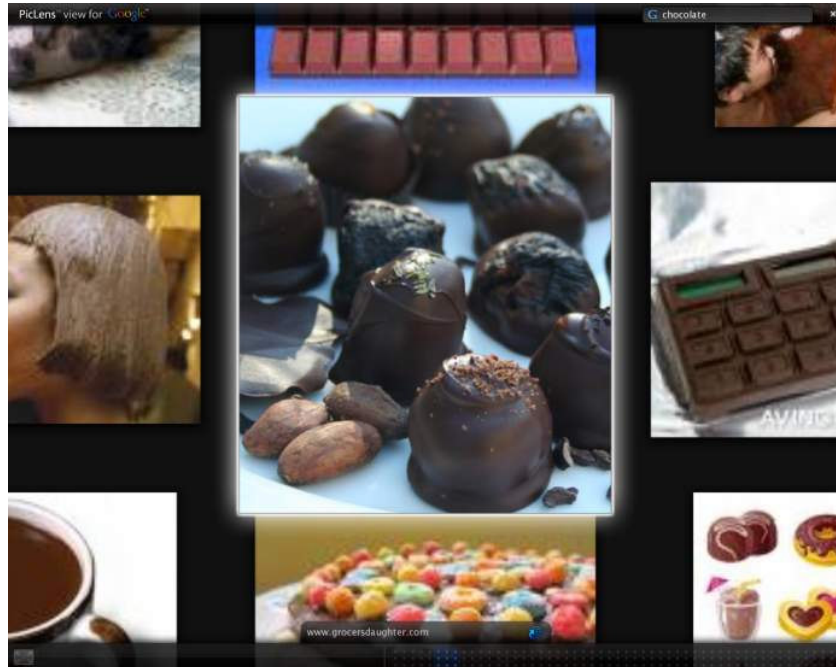
9. Open an internet browser session in **Mozilla Firefox**. You will notice that the **Google toolbar** is available on the right hand side. You can search for images by entering a keyword (e.g. chocolate) and clicking on the blue/black PicLens table icon on the right hand side.



10. Use the Blue dotted scroll bar to scan through the images.



11. You can use the wheel on your mouse to zoom in and out to view the images. When you click on an image, it will appear it's actual size.



12. Enjoy PicLens!
